#### Wells Graduate Student Award

The competition was open to papers that have been presented at academic conferences and for papers published in scholarly journals this academic year. We had six submissions for the best conference paper award and two for the best publication award. The papers were evaluated by a jury of faculty, organized by the graduate coordinator. All papers were impressive examples of mature scholarly work, showing a range of intellectual interests among our students as well as their outstanding research and writing skills.

**Best published paper**. We had two excellent contributions, a fact that made for a very difficult decision. In the end, the faculty jury selected **Rodney Sebastian's** paper for this year's award. The title of his paper was "Performing Identities: State-ISKCON Interactions in Singapore." It was published in *Proselytizing and the Limits of Religious Pluralism in Contemporary Asia* (Springer Asia Series, Volume 4). Congratulations to Rodney for your outstanding work!

**Best conference paper**. We had six excellent contributions. All papers were deserving, but in the end, the faculty jury selected two winners: **Amy Brown** and **Bhakti Mamtora**. The title of Amy's paper was "Pregnancy and a Feminist Critique of Individualism and Autonomy in Christian and Evolutionary Understandings of Subjectivity."
