Professor Manuel Vásquez has just co-edited with Josh DeWind (Social Science Research Council) a special issue of the journal *Global Networks* entitled "The Religious Lives of Migrant Minorities: A Multi-Sited and Transnational Perspective." The issue contains eight original articles based on a multi-year research project focusing on immigrant communities in London, Johannesburg/Durban, and Kuala Lumpur, which was funded by the Ford Foundation. Among the articles, there is a theoretical and methodological introduction co-written by Professor Vásquez and a piece entitled "Three Dimensions of Religious Place-Making in Diaspora," which he co-authored with Kim Knott (Lancaster University).
