PRESENTATIONS

- **Dr. Jeyoul Choi** recently gave a presentation on Max Weber's thesis on Protestantism and modernity. In the presentation, Dr. Choi revisited Max Weber's thesis on Protestantism and modernity to explore the complex ways in which South Korean Protestants have experienced modernity and modernization. He argued that, unlike its European counterpart, Korean Protestantism has played a paradoxical role by both preserving elements of the old Neo-Confucian religious culture and promoting the values of new American modernity. Dr. Choi highlighted that, caught between these influences, many Korean Protestants sought to navigate the contradictions and conflicts through migration to the United States under the broader influence of American modernity.
- Dr. Jeyoul Choi recently presented his paper, "Rupture and Resonance: Negotiating Tradition and Modernity in South Korean Protestant Life" at the Annual Meeting of the Association for the Sociology of Religion in Chicago, Illinois August 9th - 11th, 2025.
- **Dr. Yaniv Feller** virtually presented "Leo Baeck y sus contextos imperials" at the Catedra Libre de Estudios Judios Moses Mendelssohn, University of Buenos Aires. This lecture explores the context that shaped Leo Baeck's key positions, beginning with his debate with Adolf Harnack on the essence of religions. It will also address Baeck's views on Jewish missionizing, his distinction between Macht and Kraft—physical power versus spiritual energy—and his reflections on Zionism, highlighting how these themes are interconnected.

PRESENTATIONS

Over the summer, **Dr. Bron Taylor** traveled to the University of California, Santa Barbara (UCSB), where he gave two lectures and attended a conference of the International Society for the Study of Religion (ISSRNC). One of his presentations led a session on "The Greening of Religion Hypothesis Revisited," which was followed by two University of Florida Religion and Nature graduates, **Bernard Zaleha** and **Robin Globus Veldman**.

"It was especially rewarding to see strong representation from our Religion and Nature program, with seven alumni and one current graduate student all actively participating in the conference," said Professor Taylor in his reflection of the event.



The organization also publishes a quarterly publication, *Journal for the Study of Religion, Nature and Culture*, which has become a respected platform for interdisciplinary scholarship. Both the conference and the journal continue to thrive under the leadership of Professor Taylor and the many alumni who remain actively involved (pictured above).

Professor Taylor also had the honor of presenting the ISSRNC's Lifetime Achievement Award to UCSB Religion Professor Emerita Catherine Albanese. and was one of two professors invited to engage Dr. Albanese in a plenary session reflecting on her contributions to the field.



PUBLICATIONS






