

Publications

Dr. Terje Ostebo was interviewed by the newsletter Sawahil in the article titled "Seven Questions on Ethiopian Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed's Pentecostalism for Dr. Terje Ostebo". Dr. Ostebo spoke to Professor **Alex Thurston**, an Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of Cincinnati, about Ostebo's perspective as well as his recent article "The Religion of Ethiopia's Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed: Pentecostalism, Prosperity Gospel and the Power of Positive Thinking." This recent article examines the Pentecostal faith and leadership style of Ethiopian Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed, highlighting Abiy's belief that he is divinely chosen to lead Ethiopia and his blending of religious conviction with nationalist politics.

During this interview, Ostebo explains that since 1991, Ethiopia has experienced a major religious revival following the fall of the militaristic Derg regime combined with the rapid growth in expressions of Protestant and Muslim movements and increasing government attempts to monitor and co-opt religious communities. Under Abiy, the state's approach to religion shifted—as he seeks to unite religious groups rather than label them as "extremist," though political space has tightened dramatically.

Abiy's Pentecostal faith is tied less to preaching and conversion and more to a national, messianic vision of "saving" Ethiopia. He sees himself as divinely chosen to lead the country toward prosperity, holding nightly prayer meetings and framing his leadership as spiritually guided. Unlike other leaders who promoted overt religious agendas, his message is more inclusive and rooted in national unity rather than religious conversion.

Alex Thurston is an Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of Cincinnati. He was an International Affairs Fellow at the Council on Foreign Relations (2013–14) and has held fellowships with the Wilson Center and the American Council of Learned Societies. His research focuses on Islam and politics in twentieth- and twenty-first-century Northwest Africa, with fieldwork in Nigeria, Senegal, Mali, Mauritania, and Burkina Faso.
