


• **Dr. Kawashima** recently attended a conference at Uppsala University in Sweden at the 2025 SBL International Meeting. During this time, Dr. Kawashima gave a presentation on his paper "The Wilderness Period as a Rite of Passage". He examines the Exodus, Israelites' journey from Egypt, through the wilderness as both an initiation and a pilgrimage. Citing from Exodus 12 and Joshua 3-4, Dr. Kawashima argues that the journey had fundamentally transformed the identity and status of the travelers, as they departed Egypt as slaves, but re-emerged as an organized army. The exodus from Egypt had served as an act of salvation, signifying their freedom from slavery.
