- On April 14, the Ethics in the Public Sphere initiative will hold a panel discussion on "Climate Science and Ethics in the Public Sphere," with Dr. **Todd LeVasseur** (College of Charleston) and Dr. **Sadie Hundemer** (IFAS/AEC), with a response from UF student **Natalie Triana '25**, moderated by Dr. **Nia Morales** (WEC).
